## APPENDIX K Informational & Interpretive Trail Signs

Informational or interpretive signs at trailheads or strategically placed along a trail can note unique features, provide historic background, tell a story, identify points of interest, or display maps and/or rules of the trails.

To the right is a very simple sign design displaying a map of an entire trail system noting the length of each of the trails plus the addition of photos across the bottom highlighting a few of the featured offerings within this particular park. A similar sign concept featuring a map of the entire Buckhorn Trail System is recommended at primary trailheads along the route.

More detailed maps featuring specific trails within the trail system are also recommended. A map of the Lakeview Trail showing how it connects Eagle's Landing Campground to the State Park is recommended at both the State Park Trailhead and the Lakeview Trailhead. This particular map could also include the scenic overlook trail options noting some of the features one might find depending on which trail they choose to take.

Other suggested locations for trail map signage include the trailheads located at:

- Eagle's Landing Campground,
- Buckhorn Lake State Resort Park,
- Coal Field Trailhead "A",
- And in the City of Buckhorn where there will be multiple trail options from one locations.

### Interpretive Signs

A few trail locations where interpretive signs and/or wayside Exhibits would greatly enhance the trail user's experience by providing photos and information about the history of the area or unique feature includes:

- Historic Bowlingtown
- Frontier Nursing site,
- Site of WWII plane crash,
- Elk viewing area near Coal Field "A",
- The site of the Old swinging bridge in the City of Buckhorn,
- The eagle nesting site near Eagle Watch Trail.
